Successful business management demands an understanding of a firm's operations and environment, along with the command of the analytical tools essential to decision making. We educate our students in four distinct but interrelated areas:

- Analytical tools such as programming language Python.
- Functional area knowledge of the business firm (accounting, finance, management and marketing).
- Environmental issues including legal and economic frameworks.
- Technical skills in the chosen finance concentration.

REAL ESTATE MINOR

Open to all Notre Dame undergraduates, the 15-credit-hour minor leverages a range of disciplines including accounting, architecture, engineering, economics, finance and law. Students learn the fundamentals of real estate, gain exposure to a wide range of career paths and network with industry professionals.

APPLIED LEARNING

The Applied Investment Management (AIM) course was created in the fall of 1995 to give Notre Dame students the opportunity to participate in live portfolio management while developing their financial analysis skills through rigorous, fundamental equity research. The selected students-turned-analysts are charged with the research and decision-making processes required to manage a live portfolio of approximately \$13 million.

Graduate Degree

The Master of Science in Finance program is designed for working professionals to complete in a year at Notre Dame's downtown Chicago campus. Courses are offered on alternating weekends.
